The Junior college is recognized by the Govt. of Maharashtra vide **Resolution No.: HSC 1076-419-XX-XXI DT.6th May 1976.**

The college was founded on 20th June 1946 by the People's Education Society of which the Late Bharat-Ratna **Dr. BABASAHEB AMBEDKAR** was the chairman. The establishment of this college opened a new chapter in the history of higher education in the state of Maharashtra. The objective of the society in starting the institution was to cater to the educational needs of the ever-growing population of this cosmopolitan city in general and to promote higher education among the Schedule Caste and Schedule Tribe in particular.

The college is housed in Buddha Bhavan, while its office is located in Anand Bhavan both are situated in the very heart of Fort area in the city of Mumbai.

Junior college conducts the teaching of F. Y. J. C. (11th) and S. Y. J. C. (12th) in Arts, Science and Commerce Streams.

Fees for F. Y. J. C. (11th) and S. Y. J. C. (12th) of the Junior College:

Note: 1) S. C. students must submit their cast certificate.

- 2) Students entitled for any concession in fees such as Teacher's ward, E. B. C., scholarship, Free education for girl etc. will have to submit documentary evidence at the time of admission, failing which they will be charged full fees.
- 3) Fees may be revised as and when directives are received from Government of Maharashtra.
- 4) For the students from other than Maharashtra board additional charges for the eligibility transaction Rs.: 500/- to be paid with the college fees.

Penalty for late payment:

Students are required to pay their fees before last date prescribed for the payment of fees. There will be penalty of Rs. 1/- per day for the late payment till 30 days from the due date. After which the admission is likely to be cancelled.

Cancellation of Admission and Refund of Fees:

Students will be charged Rs. 50/- (Rupees Fifty only) as cancellation charges.

Government of Maharashtra Education and Youth Services Department Circular No.: HSC – 1076 / 416 – XXI dated 7th August, 1976.

- (a) If a student informs the institution before the commencement of the Academic Year that he/she wants to withdraw and he cannot continue his education in the same institution for any reason, the institution concerned should refund the tuition Fee, Term fee, Laboratory Fee(if any) and Library and Laboratory Deposits if any actually recovered from the student in full. The admission fee may, however be retained by the institution.
- (b) If a student desires to withdraw and applies for refund of fees after the commencement of the Academic Year, the institution concerned should retain the Admission Fee, Term Fee and Laboratory Fee (if any) in full and also the proportionate amount of the tuition fee till the end of the month in which the refund is claimed. The remaining amount of Tuition Fee, if any should be refunded. The Library Deposit and Laboratory Deposit should also be refunded.

Refund of Deposits (Library Deposit etc.):

- (1) Refund of the Library Deposit and / or Caution Money can be claimed within three months after the close of the Academic Year but without any arrears due to the college.
- (2) Claim for refund in the prescribed form must be made within three months from the last date of the relevant Academic Year in which the student is admitted in the college, after which period the claim will lapse.
- (3) A student leaving the college in either terms of an academic Year will be deemed to have left the College for the purpose of refund on the last day of the second term of that Academic Year.
- (4) Claims will be paid only on production of the relevant receipts in Original.

Change of College in the Second Term:

If a student desires to get his name removed from the rolls of the college in the Second Term, intimation to that effect must reach the Principal a week before the opening of the college for the Second Term, failing which the student will be liable to fees for the whole of the Second Term.

If a student desires to get his name removed from the rolls of the College in the Second Term to join another College, he has to obtain written permission of both the college and Dy. Director of Education.

If a student desires to join another College during the middle of the term then written permission must be obtained from the Dy. Director of Education or Inspector of Schools, Greater Bombay.

Eligibility rules regarding admission to F. Y. J. C. (11th) and S. Y. J. C. (12th) of the Junior College:

- (1) Students who have passed the First Year Junior College (H.S.C. Std. XI) Annual Examination and who produce a certificate from the respective institution within the jurisdiction of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary Education and Youth Services Department circular No. HSC – 1076 / 3784 – XXI dated 1975 – 1976.
- (2) Students who have passed XI Std. Examination in the new pattern of 10 Plus 2 Plus 3 adopted by different recognized, all India or state Bodies from any other State or Union Territory are eligible for Admission to the Second Year of Junior College. The Transfer Certificates of such students should however be countersigned by the Educational Inspectors or the equivalent authority of the District concerned in the State/ Union Territory.
- (3) Students who have passed the S. S. C. or equivalent examination (I.C.S.E. etc.) of any statutory or recognised Board in India will be admitted in accordance with instructions contained in the Government Circular Education Department No. HSC – 1075 – XX – XXI, dated 4th October, 1975. They are required to produce an eligibility certificate from the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary Education.
- (4) Admissions to Std. XI (F. Y. J. C.) will be through online admission process conducted by education board, Government of Maharashtra.**

Eligibility Certificate:

- (1) The students, seeking admission to the Junior College Classes and who have passed the Public Examination of the Statutory Board, Recognised Bodies and University outside the Maharashtra State will have to produce the Eligibility Certificate.
- (2) Students who will be required to submit Eligibility Certificate shall apply in a prescribed form, to the Divisional Secretary, along with a Fee of Rs. 10/-.
- (3) The Divisional Secretary shall issue Eligibility Certificate as per instruction given to him by the State Board.

Government of Maharashtra

Education and Youth Services Department

Circular No. HSC – 1075 – 1075/42272 – XX – XXX Dtd.: 19th October 1976.

“The Maharashtra State Board of Secondary Education should issue a Final Eligibility Certificate in respect of cases in which the equivalence has already been decided. However, in respect of the cases in which the equivalence has not been decided, the Board should issue a provisional Eligibility Certificate and the final Eligibility Certificate should be issued after getting the clearance of the case. The board may charge a Fee of Rs. 10/- once only, at the time of issue of the Final Eligibility Certificate, as the case may be”.

Migration Certificate for Admission:

A migration Certificate from other Statutory Board, Recognised Body or University conducting the Examination passed by the candidate shall have to be produced by the candidate coming from other states and seeking admission to 1st or 2nd year of Junior College.

Reservation of Seats for Scheduled Castes, Nav Buddhists etc.:

50% seats are reserved for students belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Nav Buddhists etc., provided they seek admission within a week from the date of declaration of the results of the Annual Examination. Thereafter their cases are considered on par with those or others.

Diploma in Pali:

Diploma course in Pali, recognised by University of Mumbai is conducted in this college. The minimum qualification required for the admission is S.S.C. or equivalent examination.

Attendance for Lectures:

The Minimum attendance of the student is 75% of the working days during the period from the opening day of the academic year to the 15th February of the following year. (Regulation 25 (i) (a) the Maharashtra Secondary Education Boards Regulations Paper II (1976) failing which the application for the Annual/Final Examination may be withdrawn under Regulation 30 (7) in respect of the students who do not fulfil condition regarding the prescribed attendance. A student whose application for the Examination to be held at the end of that Academic Year shall complete the minimum attendance prescribed under this clause (25) (i) (a).

Scholarships, Concession in Fees and College Scholarships etc.

A number of merit scholarships, half and quarter freeships are awarded to deserving students of all classes. Every student securing 70 percent or more marks in the S.S.C. Examination in the current year taken admission to the college is given Scholarship of Rs. 10/- to Rs. 15/- per mensum.

Students should note that applications for scholarships and concession in fees are to be submitted on or before July 1st on forms prescribed for the purpose and available from the office during office hours on working days.

Government of India Scholarship to Backward Class and Nav-Buddhist students are liable to be rejected on the ground that they change their courses of studies or institutions without the prior approval of the Divisional Social Welfare Officer of the State concerned

College Special scholarship to SC/ST/Buddhist students from the P. E. Society Mumbai.

The SC/ST/Buddhist students who have secured 45% of marks and above at previous examination are eligible for scheduled caste merit scholarships for the year.

Deserving students are awarded Special Scholarship by the P. E. Society, the details of which also could be obtained from the college office. All the Scheduled Castes and Nav-Buddhist students (from the state as well as from any other state get Scholarship from their respective State Government). Their details will be available in the college office.

Extra-Curricular Activities / Associations

The college aims at imparting all round training to its students. For, that alone is the basis of liberal education to promote a sense of solidarity and a spirit of comradeship among the students of the college various associations have been formed. These associations organize lectures, debates, symposia etc. Our students have greatly benefitted from the facilities offered to them and have secured for the college many distinctions in debating, elocution and drama competitions.

College Magazine

The magazine is an annual feature of the college comprising section from different languages. From year 1964-65 a special research section, entitled "Siddha" has been introduced with a view to publishing valuable articles of the members of the Staff on several topics of academic interest.

Sports

The college authorities provide all the facilities to give the necessary fillip to sports in the college. The college has been participating in all the inter collegiate tournaments and has won accolades in cricket, boxing, football, hockey, basketball, volleyball, kabaddi, etc.

National Cadet Corps

The college has B Coy. Of the National Cadet Corps attached to first Maharashtra Battalion N.C.C. with ANO care taker Mr. Dananjay Chandanshive.

Air Wing: There is an Air Wing attached to 1st Maharashtra Air sqdn. which is open to all college students.

Naval Wing: Students can also join the Naval Wing attached to 1st Naval Unit. The N. C. C. has also a girls Troops open to all girl students. Enrollment in N. C. C. and Physical Training is voluntary for the male as well as female students.

General Rules:

- (1) Students shall abide by the rules and regulations laid down for their discipline and development of the college.
- (2) Students must put in a minimum attendance of three-fourths of the number of working days in a term to be eligible for the grant of a term as required by the HSC Board of Mumbai. The schedule of terms will be displayed on the notice board. Scheduled Castes and Schedule Tribes, Nav-Buddhist and other Backward Class and Economically Backward Class students who have been granted free Studentship will also be required to keep 75% attendance during each term in order to avail themselves of free studentship, in accordance with the rules for such awards.
- (3) Students should not be found loitering during college hours. While moving from one class to other students should keep to left, walk in single file and observe silence. Students should also observe silence near Principal and Vice-Principal's Chambers, Staff Common Room, staircases and in the office.
- (4) Students should be properly and neatly dressed within college premises and will co-operate with the authorities of the college in keeping the classroom, premises, staircases and office neat and clean.
- (5) Students must not abstain themselves from the College Examinations without the advance permission of the Principal.
- (6) Students must not smoke or use sun glasses within the college premises and must not do anything inside or outside the college that will in any way interfere with its orderly administration and discipline.
- (7) Students are prohibited from organizing meetings, entertainments and collecting money without the permission of the Principal.
- (8) No student will be allowed to take active part in politics or religion or impose his / her views on any one. Academic atmosphere should be maintained.
- (9) No student should communicate any information about any matter concerning the College to the Press. All grievances should be brought to the notice of the college Principal.

- (10) An Identity card will be issued to every student admitted to the college. He/she, must always carry the card with his photograph affixed to it and must present it for inspection, whenever demanded by the College authorities.
- (11) Students receiving Government or College Scholarships should note that they should fulfill the following conditions:
 - a. That the student is regular in attendance
 - b. That the student's performance is satisfactory
 - c. That the student should not abstain himself / herself from the college examinations without obtaining prior permission of the Principal
 - d. That the student shows sufficient progress in studies
- (12) Visitors to students are not allowed during college hours. If they desire to invite a friend to attend a lecture, prior permission of the lecturer concerned must be obtained. Students themselves must not attend classes other than their own classes, without prior permission of the Principal or the lecturer concerned.
- (13) Students are expected to take proper care of college property. Any damage to the furniture, fittings, equipment or library books will be looked upon as breach of discipline and will be met with due punishment.
- (14) Students are expected to pay their fees / dues by the specified date failing which their names will be struck off from the rolls of the college without previous warning.
- (15) Students are expected to read all the notices displayed on the Notice boards from time to time and keep in touch with the circulars and notifications issued by the college or board authorities on academic and other matters. The plea of ignorance of circulars and notifications etc. **WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**
- (16) Students are expected to keep their guardians in regular touch with the progress of their studies and other college matters. Guardians are presumed to have acquainted themselves with and agreed to the rules and regulations of the college when they send their wards for admission to the College.
- (17) Students must behave with due respect towards their teachers and obey them. Any breach of this rule shall render a student liable to be punished including expulsion from the college.
- (18) Students should collect the H.S.C. Examinations Admission Card as per the date notified on the notice board or at least four days prior to commencement of H.S.C. examination. No examination Admission Card will be issued after the commencement of the examination under any circumstances. After collecting the admission card, the students should go through it and if any mistake is found, they should bring it to the notice of the College office in writing (for example spelling mistake in name, subject, set, etc.)

Railway Concessions to Bonafide Students

Students up to 25 years of age are entitled to get railway concession according the existing rules pursuant to a recent directive from the Railways. Students desiring to avail the railway concession will have to produce ration card or census number or election number or Aadhar card as proof of their residential address in the suburbs for **LOCAL RAILWAY CONCESSION**. Students should apply 2 days in advance of the date (excluding holidays if any) on which they desire to have concession.

For long distance railway concession during vacations, students of the age group mentioned above must apply at least one week in advance if their native place address is mentioned in the admission form. No student will be allowed for any college or board examination without college identity card.
